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Nankyoku Shiryo (Antarctic Record, ISSN 0085-7289) provides the publication of preliminary scientific results using materials/data from the Antarctic expeditions by all nations. Publication is not limited to the articles related with the Antarctic, but also includes those related with all polar research such as the Arctic. It covers notes on official records of the expedition. Participants to the expeditions are encouraged for submission. Authors can select one of the following categories of article: *scientific paper, scientific note, review, report, symposium/meeting report and news*.

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Nankyoku Shiryo (Antarctic Record, ISSN 0085-7289) is published three times a year (March, July and November). Authors are requested to submit, with their manuscripts, a sheet of submission to indicate the contact address, fax number and e-mail address, *etc.* In case of more than one author, please indicate to whom the correspondence should be addressed. The format of the sheet is available upon request to <http://www.nipr.ac.jp/~library/e>. Manuscripts for the Journal should be sent to:

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Three copies for the scientific papers or two copies for other articles which were prepared according to the **Technical details** should be submitted. Arrival date of the manuscripts to the editorial committee of NIPR is registered as the received date.

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Technical details

Language

The official languages of Antarctic Record are Japanese and English. [English articles should start with an abstract in Japanese, headed by a Japanese translation of the title. Authors can ask for the Japanese translation to be written by the editor.]

Preparation of the text

- (a) The manuscript should preferably be prepared on a word processor and printed with double spacing and wide margins and include an abstract of not more than 200 words.
- (b) Authors should use S.I. units.
- (c) The title page should include the name(s) of the author(s), their affiliations and addresses. In cases of more than 50 letters for the title, authors should indicate a running title.
