## Preface

This is the last of a series of data reports in the Glaciological Research Program in Mizuho Plateau - West Enderby Land. The program was begun in 1969 by the 10th Japanese Antarctic Research Expedition and finished in February 1975. Earlier results have been published as JARE Data Reports Nos. 17, 27 and 28.

The data in this report were obtained mainly in 1974 - 1975 by JARE-15, which accomplished two long survey traverses to further south and east from Mizuho Camp and five short traverses between Syowa Station and Mizuho Camp and occupied Mizuho Camp for 10 months.

I hope this report will contribute to our better understanding of glaciological aspect of Mizuho Plateau - West Enderby Land.

On this occasion, I wish to express my hearty appreciation to Mr. Nozomi Murakoshi, leader of the wintering party of JARE-15, and to the members of JARE-15 field parties for their efforts to obtain these valuable data.
